




















CTE prepares students for The Real World

scholarships to any TTC school of their choice.



CTE classes are important because they give students a better understanding of many career opportunities.









Although the team only had eleven members, they competed in two invitational meets and went to the state tournament. Garret Fulks says, "Loretto Archery makes other teams quiver!"










FBLA




























Defermination









Tournament Team as well.


When the players hit the field they remembered their motto, "Till I Collapse." This meant they gave it all until they could not give anymore.








My point is every announcement that stopped us in our tracks, has also kept us in line. Each had a major role in getting us to this field.


