KINDERGARTEN THROUGH EIGHTH GRADE 2026 - 2027 Assessment Information

STATE MANDATED ASSESSMENTS – PURPOSE, USE, and DATES

Universal Screening Grades K-8th: AIMSweb Plus, STAR Reading, and HMH Math

These benchmark assessments will be utilized to identify students whose performance warrants further investigation. They identify who is likely to require additional support to achieve grade-level performance expectations. Parents will receive notification if the results indicate the child meets the requirements for additional academic support and intervention(s). If the student qualifies for intervention, parents will be notified of the progress every 4.5 to 5 weeks.

TCAP Grades 2-8 (English language arts, Math, Science, Social Studies)

These fully aligned assessments capture the depth and breadth of what students are learning-and have been learning in the classroom every day. The information from these assessments will provide educators, parents, and students with a comprehensive perspective on their academic progress compared to their peers across Tennessee, as well as a clearer understanding of a student's strengths, needs, and areas for growth.

*Available for students with disabilities for whom participation in the regular state assessment is inappropriate, even with the use of extensive accommodations. Parents will receive a detailed report of the student's performance after the completion of the school year.

ELPA 21

ELPA 21 is used to determine English language proficiency levels. These results will help guide decisions regarding student participation in content area classrooms without program support and state academic content assessments without accommodations. The results also provide school systems with data about the effectiveness of EL programs.

Kindergarten Screener

The K Screener is a district-developed assessment, comprised of two parts: literacy and math. All kindergarten students will be assessed during the first week of school. Results will be shared with parents at the initial conference during that first week. This test will provide teachers and parents with valuable information to guide instruction, highlighting strengths and areas for improvement.

Mastery Connect Predictive Assessments

These assessments help students demonstrate the skills they possess at key points during the school year. They reflect TDOE's state assessment rigor and ensure students are prepared for the next steps in their academic career. Rigorous questions will be used to measure students' abilities in writing, critical thinking, and problem-solving. The reports generated from scoring will assist teachers in planning instruction and provide parents with information about academic standards mastery, as well as predict summative outcomes, including areas of weakness and strength.

High School Assessment Information

TCAP End of Course Tests in English I, II, Algebra I, II, Geometry, and US History

The reports generated from scoring will assist teachers in planning instruction and provide parents with information about academic gains, weaknesses, and strengths.

UNIVERSAL SCREENING - EARLY WARNING SYSTEM

An Early Warning System will be utilized to determine the need for the administration of an AIMS Web assessment. This assessment will help determine if a student requires additional support to achieve grade-level performance. It uses brief, valid, and reliable measures of reading and math performance in grades K - 12. Parents will be contacted if an assessment is needed, and the results will be shared.

Date of Administration: As needed by the student on an individual basis at the beginning of the school year and at the end.

ACT

Beginning with the graduating class of 2018, students enrolled in Tennessee public schools during their eleventh grade year must complete the ACT or SAT prior to graduation (see High School Policy 2.103). The students in Tennessee will have the opportunity to take a college entrance exam in the familiar surroundings of their own school, on a school day, at no cost to them. The test will be administered online.
