District Goals

- Reading- All students will show an increase in reading proficiency.
*Long Term Goal: 90% of students will be reading on grade level by 3rd grade
- Math- All students will reach high standards and will attain proficiency or better in mathematics.

In the 2nd Grade Classroom

In the 2nd Grade Classroom we will work with students and families to support students' success in reading, math, science, and social studies. Some of our key connections will be:

- Homework Folders...These go home each night with students and have nightly homework, notes from school, and other important study lists that the students need to have access to all year.
- Weekly Assessments...These assessments continually review skills we have covered this year, and the students are accountable for this information on a weekly basis, ensuring they do not forget the topics we covered earlier in the school year.
- Weekly Assignment Sheet...This sheet stays inside your child's Homework Folder. This sheet features assignments and activities happening in 2nd grade.
- Biweekly Graded Papers... These will be sent home and need to be reviewed, signed, and sent back to school.
- Lunch Bunch Reading Incentive...This reading reward is offered each nine weeks to students reaching a set goal of reading points.
- The REMIND app to be able to receive announcements from school.

At Home

- ★ Check homework folder and Weekly Assignment Sheet daily.
- ★ Return notes in a timely manner.
- ★ Go over Graded Papers with your child.
- ★ Attendance is necessary if your child is well.
- ★ Be positive about school in general, encourage success, and help your child relate school lessons to real life situations.
- ★ Promote lifelong learning.
- ★ Encourage your child to form healthy habits, including (but not limited to) good sleep habits, well-balanced meals and snacks, and proper grooming and hygiene habits.
- ★ Make math useful. Connect real world situations that require math.
- ★ Make reading enjoyable. Read with your children. Talk about books together. Make this a fun family activity.
- ★ Virtual avenues of information include Google Meet, Google classroom, Facebook live, and the LCSS school app.

Our Students

New Prospect Elementary School students joined our 2nd grade teachers to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in reading and math.

- Read over Our School Promise each week that will be kept inside the Homework Folder.
- Read at least 20 minutes a day outside of school to build my vocabulary and boost my reading skills.
- Review basic math facts 10 minutes a day to improve math fluency.
